Chief Constable Paul Sanford is urging Norfolk residents to use the Street Safe online tool to report areas where they feel unsafe in the county.

The Street Safe tool enables anyone to anonymously flag public places and mark on a map the areas where they feel unsafe while remaining anonymous, and while anyone can use it, women and girls are particularly being encouraged to use the online platform.

Launched by the Home Office and Police Digital Service, the tool, which is being piloted across England and Wales until the end of November can be accessed by clicking on: www.police.uk/streetsafe

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Over the last month PC Pegden has been carrying out further joint collaborative working with the IFCA (Inshore Fisheries Conservation Authority) with their shared asset RIB conducting joint preventative marine crime patrols in the local harbours and coastal patrols.

He has also met with the Wells Water Safety Forum which includes RNLI, Coastguard, Lifeguards, Holkham Estate and the Wells Coast Watch Team.

PC Pegden has also been carrying out joint working with Victory Housing and the NNDC with regard to tenant issues and attended the RNLI day at Hunstanton RNLI Station where he engagement with the public around coastal and marine crime related issues.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 30th September)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	3	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	3	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	1	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
