All change! I have now returned from my 12 month secondment with our Designing Out Crime Team. Apologies for the delay in getting this month's Newsletter out to you. While I have been away some restructuring has taken place and I will now be covering the North Norfolk and Great Yarmouth Districts. I would like to say a heartfelt thank you to Daisy Woodward-Smith who has been covering in my absence. Daisy has now taken up a new position as the Communications and Engagement Coordinator for the Norwich District.

As part of my role each month, I will now be producing 22 Community Updates which are shared across both districts to provide you with up to date contact details, a list of the current policing priorities, the date of your next Priority Setting Meeting, a snapshot of last month's crime and an update from your Beat Manager. - Addressing Deer Poaching and Hare Coursing
- Greater inter-agency collaboration with RNLJ, Easter Inshore Fisheries Conservation Authority and Border Force to tackle immigration and drug offences.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

The biggest news for Wells is that PC Jason Pegden has left the police to pursue a career with IFCA and there is a new Sheriff in town, Me!

In line with the current Neighbourhood Priorities we have worked closely with our partner agencies Border Force and IFCA. Both have visited Wells and liaised with police on several occasions over the last few weeks. We have also conducted joint training with Border Force in the form of a sea survival course at PETANS.

The other Priority was to deter and disrupt hare coursing in the local rural areas. I have liaised with both the Walsingham and the Holkham estates, as well as local farmers, to raise awareness and stress the importance of reporting incidents to the police.

We have conducted a joint, night time, marine training exercise with the Wells Coast Guard and Wells RNLJ to simulate a search of the marshes for missing persons/illegal immigration during an exceptionally high tide.

We have also increased high visibility police patrols of the Northfield estate to deter anti-social behaviour and to disrupt casual drug use in the area.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st January)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	1	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	0	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
